A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

Practicing The Way

"And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ" Ephesians 3:17 & 18

Growing deeper in our love for Christ is a part of being a disciple of Christ. It is a life-long process where we are becoming more and more like Jesus.

So, at the start of this year, I asked the question on "How can we as a church and as individuals make disciples?" I have been praying about that very question throughout the year and wondered what God might have us do? On a practical level, I have been wondering what can we as a church do to help each other grow our "roots deeper" in our love for Christ?

Well, it was while I was on my trip to Armenia back in June that I read the book Practicing the Way, by John Mark Comer, and his writing prompted me to think that if we as a church followed what Comer was suggesting, our lives would change and the world around us would change. We would be growing as disciples of Jesus and we would encourage others to be Jesus' disciple. Comer's main point is that being more like Jesus is possible "if we are willing to arrange our lives around the practices, rhythms, and truths that Jesus himself did, which will open our lives to God's power to change." We can be transformed as we are more like Jesus.

In September we are going to look more deeply at the book Practicing the Way (you will hear more about that next month) but for now, let me encourage you to get the book (you can find it on Amazon) and start reading it and I know that it will have a profound effect upon your life as a disciple of Jesus.

Have a great rest of the summer and I look forward to seeing you at LCPC.

Lakeside Christian Helps Center Back to School Donations Needed





PROPERTY UPDATE

Earlier in the year, LCPC published an article comparing the similarities of Nehemiah rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem and the condition of our church. The mighty fortress lay in ruins, but God influenced the King of Persia's heart to allow Nehemiah and a small group to begin the rebuild. When the wall was rebuilt, it represented a recommitment to God, to the lives of the people, and to the community.

By the time this article is published, the painting of the church campus will be complete. I know you all must be growing weary of the construction disruption as it feels like LCPC has undergone its own small Nehemiah moment. Since March LCPC has removed outdated gas lines from the roof, replacing all rotted and termite damaged eaves, fascia and roofing plywood, rebuilding the cover walkway, installed new roofs, major stucco repair, new landscape, concrete repair and poured new concrete for improved handicap access, and most recently the painting of the church campus. The painting required sanding large sections of the cinder block and brick walls due to it crumbling. It is expected that by applying Sure Loc, additional stucco repair, two coats of primer and two coats of paint, the buildings will be protected for a number of years.

Unfortunately, there is still more to do. The planned Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall ADA restroom access continues through the maze of the County approval process. A grant proposal has been submitted to help defray some of the costs, so please keep this in prayer that LCPC will be awarded the \$2500 grant.

We have two large glulam beams and supporting posts in the sanctuary garden that require replacement. The company who created the sanctuary beam repair in 2001 was contacted and will provide LCPC with an updated repair scheme quote. The original repair will no longer pass current building code, so a new scheme is necessary. We will need permits and a contractor to perform the repair. The sanctuary front doors are disintegrating and need to be replaced. Funds are needed to complete the projects, so please consider giving to the building fund. It is our hope that the repairs and improvements made demonstrate LCPC commitment to God, our church family, and to the community.

PRAYER MINISTRY

Approximately 16 people attended what may be LCPC's first Prayer Breakfast. We had a delicious pancake and sausage breakfast with fresh fruit, and together as one body prayed for our community, church, requests submitted to the church, our church family, friends, those who serve in harm's way, and the missionaries the church supports. We closed with everyone receiving a prayer jar containing 77 scriptures and making a prayer keychain with color beads to remind us of the Lord's Prayer. We will hold another prayer breakfast and a prayer vigil later this year. If you haven't participated, you are encouraged to join us at our next event.

WOMEN'S MINSITRY, GROWING IN FAITH TOGETHER (G.I.F.T.)

All women are invited and encouraged to come and participate in the women's group, G.I.F.T. The purpose is to have fun, laugh, get to know each other, pray for each other, encourage one another and support each other. Whenever there is an event outside of the church we carpool, so no excuses not to participate. This past year we went to a one day women's retreat in Pine Valley, watched a matinee in Mission Valley, played Bunco, attended a craft fair at Summer's Past Farm, had breakfast in the Fireside Room while making sunshine bags to be distributed to other women who need an extra dose of prayer and joy.

The remaining balance of the year we have plans to go to Balboa Park to watch a Silent Movie at the Organ Pavilion (all church event), go to Poway's Farmer's Market, have pizza and watch a movie, more Bunco, another breakfast, and finally we will close the year by enjoying the Christmas decorations in Balboa Park on a Tuesday so we can also visit the museums for free.

PRAYER QUILT NEWS

The Prayer Quilt group has now administered 774 Prayer Quilt dedications. The responses we receive from Prayer Quilt recipients are very touching and assures us how worthwhile this ministry is.

On July 22nd we gathered at the home of Sioux Swart for a pot-luck luncheon. These periodic luncheons give us an opportunity to socialize and bond as friends.

We are now beginning to prepare for our annual sale which will be on Sunday, October 21, in Rooms 1 and 2, like last year. As usual we will have many handcrafted items: sewn, knitted, and crocheted, and some home baked goodies! In addition, we will have the "Make an Offer" table.

Are you aware that on the back of each of our Prayer Quilts there is a cross? Also, on the back of each quilt there is a personalized label for the recipient which includes their name, date of dedication and an appropriate Bible verse. We want to extend our thanks to the members of the congregation for their time to say a prayer for each quilt recipient as they tie a square knot. We have received many expressions of gratitude for the quilts and frequent validation of the power of the prayers tied into the quilt.

The Prayer Quilt group is dedicated to our mission and has become a close-knit group of friends. We welcome any new members and look forward to seeing everyone at our upcoming sale!
